

Checklist for Students Considering the TEACH Grant

- The Federal TEACH Grant program provides funds to postsecondary students who are completing or planning to complete coursework that is needed to begin a career in teaching.
- Students must agree to serve for at least four years as a full-time, highly qualified teacher in a high-need field, in a school serving low-income students.
- Eligible full-time students may receive up to \$4,000 per year in TEACH Grant funds, up to a maximum of \$16,000 for undergraduate and post-baccalaureate study, and \$8,000 for graduate study.
- Students who fail to complete the four years of teaching service within eight years after completing coursework, will
